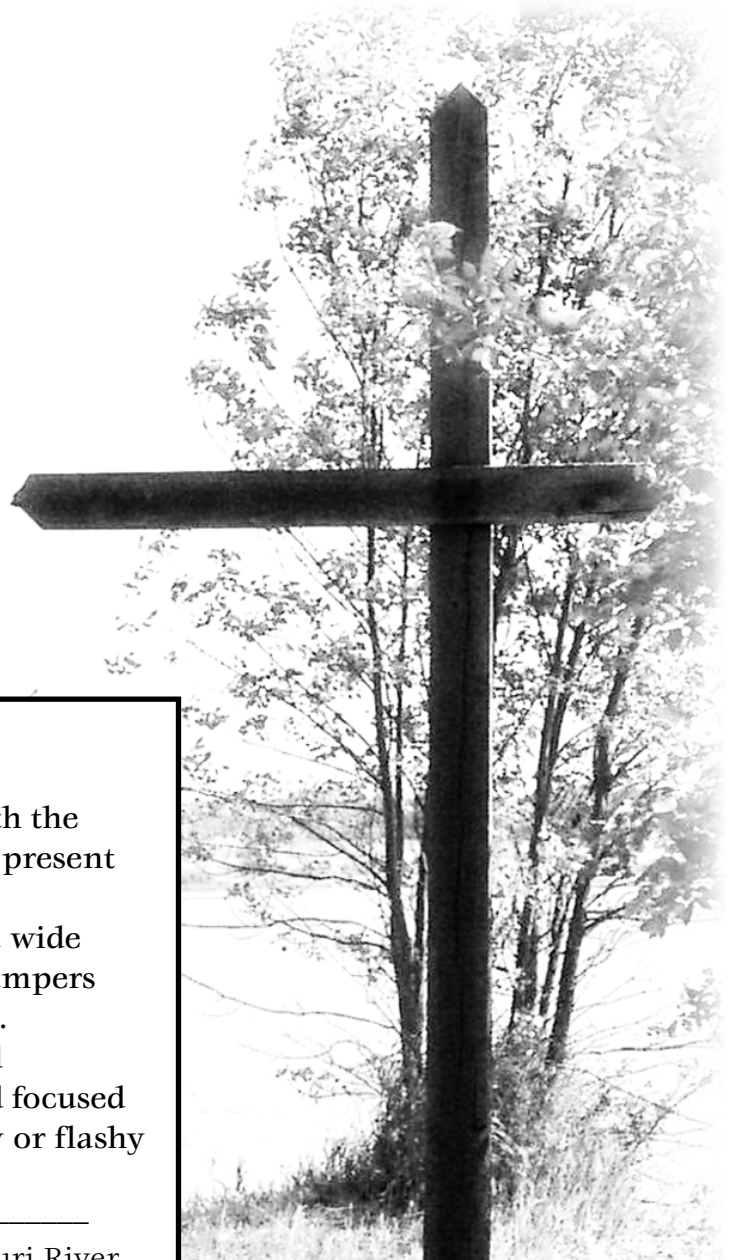

Asbury Camp is an interdenominational camp directed by a board of directors.


The board strives at all times to provide quality programs and physical facilities to those who wish to participate in the camping program.
